<u>Item 2:</u> Gilmore 4 harness floor loom, 6 treadle, 32 inch weaving width, 10 dent reed, sectional warp beam. Very good condition. Also included is a slant top bench with a slide out drawer. \$550. See pictures below.





<u>Item 3:</u> Louet S-10 spinning wheel, single treadle, 3 bobbins. Very good condition - \$350.
