#### Message from Dee Dee King:

# November Workshop: Dying with Acid Wool Dyes presented by Lindsay Dion and Dee Dee King

Have you ever been curious about how to dye your own yarn, fiber, or felt? Come to the November meeting and learn how simple it is to put color on protein fibers.

Lindsay is going to demonstrate her magic pot method of dyeing without having to constantly start a new pot with every color change. Participants will be able to choose a color from the chart and wait until it is the time to put their fiber into the pot for that color! Yes, you can dye orange and blue in the same pot. Just not at the same time.

Dee Dee will lead the participants who are interested in learning "space dying" in the microwave. You will be amazed how fast dye will strike into the fiber with the addition of heat. She will show you some methods of dyeing in a bag with loose fibers and roving that are fun to try.

There will also be a short discussion of dye and dye safety for the whole group to start.

#### What you need if you wish to participate:

Remember we are dying Protein fibers - something that was grown on an animal.

- 1. Loosely tied skeins of yarn, roving or loose fibers with a way to contain them (a lingerie bag works well) Try to make sure your yarn or fiber is wet through, although we will have buckets to use to soak if you need them.
- 2. Wear old clothes. We will be working with some strong dyes, and drips are part of the fun. Wearing an old pair of tennis shoes is a good idea.

Dyes and gloves will be provided.
