
<u>Message from your Membership Chairman</u>: the benefits of a paid membership are many; here are a few:

Weaving is a solitary endeavor, and many of us grow in our outlook when we get input. That input could come from anywhere, such as nature, fashion, family needs, friends, the internet, travel, prayer, a good book, necessity...

Regular practice is also something that helps us grow in our fiber skills. So, how do we keep it going and even more importantly, how do we GROW in what we choose to do?

Lately, well, in the last several years, I have noticed some things within the fiber world that could be a positive addition to our repertoire. If you knit, there are yarn subscriptions where a variety of yarns, chosen by the shop, are sent to you monthly. I think weavers could do the same sort of thing, but challenge ourselves to use a new (or at least less used) fiber to produce a woven piece. I have been doing a tapestry diary, weaving on an ongoing piece at least an hour each day. I am learning new things and reminding myself of things I need to remember, as I get better at weaving tapestry.
