Information from DeeDee for our spinning/dyeing day:

July 8th Spin-in at Dee Dee King's home in Squaw Valley.

Annual spin-in meeting, 10:00 - ? This year we have added the fun project of dyeing on cellulose fibers; that is anything that comes from a plant, including cotton, linen, rayon, ramie, etc. This is a wonderful way to space dye prepared warps, and easy way to create "ikat" looks on warps for dishtowels, napkins and yardage. Wear old clothes, as dyes tend to spatter, and bring something to put your dyed items in. Cellulose dye needs to "cure" for 12 to 24 hours before you rinse it, so protect your car by bringing a container to put your wet dyed items in to take home. They will be in plastic bags, but that is not very secure.

Details:

* There will be a potluck luncheon. Iced tea, coffee, and lemonade will be provided as well as a morning snack.

* If you want to try ice dyeing, bring a white t-shirt to dye, this is a tye-dye technique.

* <u>A materials fee of \$5 will be charged if you want to dye</u> to cover the cost of the dyes and chemicals.

- * There will be no formal guild meeting.
- * Bring your spinning wheel, knitting or a project to work on as well as a folding chair.

Directions to Dee Dee King's home: 38947 Willowood Lane, Squaw Valley CA.

From Fresno:

Head East on Highway 180. After climbing up into the foothills, turn right on George Smith Road. Follow George Smith for about 8 miles, bearing left at Mistletoe. Bear left to stay on Mistletoe by the little store. Right on Squaw Valley Road, turn right on Shorewood. Right again on Willowood Lane. Continue on Willowood for about a mile. We are the 2nd driveway to the right past "Rusty Acres".

From Visalia:

Head north on 63 through Cutler/Orosi. Stay on 63 until the stop sign at Sand Creek Road. Turn right on Sand Creek. Go about 8 miles on Sand Creek to the stop sign at Mistletoe. Turn right on Mistletoe and right again on Squaw Valley road. 2nd street right is Shorewood. Turn right onto Shorewood and right again on Willowood. Continue on Willowood for about a mile. We are the 2nd driveway to the right past "Rusty Acres".

From Highway 99:

Exit 99 at Manning Ave. Head east through Reedley and continue on to stop sign at Hills Valley (this is about 20 miles total). Go straight over a hill to stop sign at Highway 63. Turn left on 63 to the stop sign at Sand Creek Road. Right onto Sand Creek. Go about 8 miles on Sand Creek to the stop sign at Mistletoe. Turn right on Mistletoe and right again on Squaw Valley road. 2nd street right is Shorewood. Turn right onto Shorewood and right again on Willowood. Continue on Willowood for about a mile. We are the 2nd driveway to the right past "Rusty Acres".

You will lose cell phone signals halfway up the hill. I think that GPS will still work.

August meeting details:

We will be making a wet felted poppy pin. There is a \$5.00 material charge. Please bring a rolling pin, scissors and a plastic or glass bottle with a lip 1/2 inch or more. Small water bottles are only have a 1/4 in. lip.
