It will be a day dedicated to working on your charity projects if you have one, or spin, or felt. If you have a special mini-project you want to demonstrate, feel free to bring it along. To start the meeting, we will have our regular guild business, then we are going to put the labels and thrums on the bags for show and sale, and then we are going to move the tables and have some fun with our various projects.

News from the Guild Library:

Several new additions have come to our Guild Library! They were purchased from Guild funds recently. They are

Next Steps in Weaving, What You Never Knew You Needed To Know, by Pattie Graver. In this book, the weaver will explore a variety of weave structures and concepts in depth and detail, including twill, color-and-weave, overshot, summer and winter, and lace. Each topic is explained and supplemented with instructions for weaving a sampler and a project so you can grasp the concepts and design your own projects.

Weaving Made Easy, Revised and Updated, by Liz Gipson. In this book there are 17 projects using a rigid-heddle loom. Projects include woven scarves and belts, pillows, napkins and even a handwoven rug, all done on the rigid heddle loom!

Easy Weaving with Supplemental Warps - Overshot, Velvet, Shibori, and More, by Deb Essen. In this book you will learn the author's easy warping method; how to turn drafts for one shuttle weaving and her tips and techniques for warping a supplementary draft successfully. There are eight projects included in the book, each exploring a different supplemental warp structure from turned overshot and monk's belt to Bedford cord and even velvet.

The last book is:

A weaver's Book of 8-Shaft Patterns, by Carol Strickler. This is a wonderful book and contains more than 25 different types of threadings and nearly 900 fabric samples with their respective drafts. The weaver can skip through the book, picking and choosing drafts to try, or dig into a single weave and explore it in depth.

A DVD, *In Praise of Simple Cloth*, by Rita Buchanan has been given to the Guild Library. This is a 2-DVD that contains exploring the possibilities of a fiber; matching yarns for a project and much more from a master spinner who spins all day!



<u>Kaweah Konnection</u>: Watch for Sharon's announcement in your e-mail this Fall for the time and place of the next meeting. Instructional weaving/spinning DVD's are occasionally featured and "Show and Tell" is always interesting.

<u>Squeekie Wheels:</u> Squeekies meet the third Friday of every month, and the hours are from 9am until 1pm. The only thing we have to remember to bring is our "inside the library quiet voices". That might be the hardest thing for me to remember, because spinning with such nice people is so much fun.
