2: Spinning Round Robin



January's Guild Meeting will focus on spinning skills, so blow the Christmas dust off your spinning wheel and bring it along! Depending on how many members want to participate in spinning, we will divide participants up into interest groups.

We have leaders on tap who will talk about; spinning novelty yarns using core spinning (two different approaches), one group looking at plying, a long draw group, and Sophie is going to speak to her group about teaching someone to spin, what's really important. I would like these smaller sessions to be part demonstration, part seminar. The group leaders will show you their chosen skill, and then give you a short time to practice, as well as asking what has been your experience with this?

Unfortunately, if you do not know how to spin on a wheel, this will not be a meeting to teach those skills; however, we can give you starting pointers.

Remember, however, that the Exeter Library owns an extra wheel to use at our Squeekies meetings for demonstration and practice. Let me know if you have an interest in learning to spin.

Please bring: Extra bobbins for your wheel, some fine yarn to use to ply or

core spin, some singles spun yarn for practicing plying, scissors, and some open and easy-to-spin roving.
