As you know, we have been holding our meetings on zoom since last year. You may not know that it is possible to attend a zoom meeting with just your telephone, it doesn't even have to be a smart telephone! We encourage you to try this format, even if you are uncomfortable/unsure.

The phone number and login information will be in the email invitation this month, and is also at the end of this notice. Additional instructions as to how to use Zoom with a telephone are at the end of this notice.

Voting will be done by raising of hands. If you are attending by phone, you will be asked to digitally raise your hand to vote. This is done by pressing *9 on your phone. If you would like to speak, also raise your hand (actual or digitally). The moderator (me) will call on you. From a phone, press *6 to speak. Don't forget to press *6 after you are done speaking to mute your call again. Even a very little background noise is disruptive when 30 callers are unmuted!:)

Joining a meeting by phone only

- 1. Dial an in-country number. If you dial a toll number, your carrier rates will apply. You can find the numbers on your meeting invitation.
- 2. You will be prompted to enter the meeting ID the ID provided to you by the host (889 0165 9239), followed by #.
- 3. If the meeting has not already started and join before host is not enabled, you will be prompted to enter the host key to start the meeting, or to press # to wait if you are participant.

- 4. You will be prompted to enter your unique participant ID. This only applies if you have joined on the computer or mobile device or are a panelist in a webinar. This is not you if you are just calling in. Press # to skip.
- 5. You may be prompted to enter the meeting passcode, followed by #. (227068#)
