A reminder from Dee Dee:

Are you keeping up with your yarn diet? So far I have not purchased any weaving yarn for 2023. I am really trying to work from what I already have. Spinners, put more fiber in your diet. You can do it.



Dee Dee's 2023 Guild Challenge

I have too much yarn! When companies like Webs first got started, they would offer "odd lots" of yarns for bulk pricing. You didn't have much choice in color, but the price was fantastic. I used to buy a lot of yarn that way from different companies, so I have a very selfish challenge for the new year that is really suited for me. I know that not all of you have a stash of

yarn that is great (as in large), but I think that everyone probably has a few bins of yarn that they don't quite know what to do with. You spinners are not exempt from having a stash of excess fiber to spin as well. So, with that in mind I propose that we go on a "yarn diet", or you spinners "add more fiber to your diet" in an effort to reduce our bulky stashes. Here are a few guidelines to help in your efforts to "lose weight" (yarn and fiber).

- Go on a yarn diet (weave until you can't anymore before buying anymore yarn)
- Spinners try to use up your stash fiber by spinning it up.
- Keep track of what you use up, so at the end of the year we can compare how well we "reduced".
- I say that yarn or fiber you need for a study group project would be exempt. Also, any custom orders that you need a special color for would be exempt as well.

This should be a fun challenge, and I have already started my "yarn diet". Challenge accepted. Thanks for the idea of a yarn diet from the Ravelry group, Warped Weavers.

Book Review:

A Handweaver's Pattern Book by Marguerite Porter Davison

Published 1958, 217 pages

This book by Marguerite Davison, is THE classic of all classics and one of the first weaving books I bought when I first started to learn to weave. If you are planning on weaving anything with multiple harnesses (more than two), this book should be in your library. Luckily for us, it is in the Guild library available for you to check out. This is a book of weaving patterns. Davison collected and organized it by types of weaves, such as twills, overshot, crackle weave, etc. I refer this book for almost every project I weave, even after weaving for over 40 years! If you want this book for your own library, be sure to purchase the one with the green cover. This book was reprinted (with an orange cover), and several chapters from the original text were eliminated. A very valuable resource for handweavers. You could weave out of this book forever.
