Over the course of a year, each designer explored how to weave longevity, compostability, and respect for the soil, only using local natural fibers grown on climate-friendly farms and ranches into their designs. Lisa used locally produced materials from Ducor, Aptos, and Brooks (California) to create garments for the show in Point Reyes
